Biography

Helen Margaret Hall was born on 10 July 1915 in Busseton, Western Australia.¹

She married Peter Innes Donegan on 15 September 1936 in St Georges Cathedral in Perth. They had one daughter, in 193x. Peter died in 1939 in an aviation accident.

She remarried on 2 July 1941, to William Murray Wilson, also in St Georges Cathedral.² They had two sons.

She died on 21 February 2000 in East Fremantle, Western Australia, at the Braemar nursing home.

Mrs. Peter Donegan (nee Margaret Hall), late of Carnarvon and Pilot Officer Murray Wilson were, married in St. George's Cathedral, Perth, on July 3. Pilot-Officer Wilson left for Sydney on July 12.

Helen Margaret Hall was born at Nurse Killerby's Hos-

pital in Busselton, Western Australia³ on 10 July 1915.⁴ Her parents (Harold Aubrey Hall⁵ and Helen Rose Hall (née Lodge)⁶) were living there at the time.

She married Peter Innes Donegan⁷ on 15 September 1936 in St Georges Cathedral in Perth.⁸ Aubrey wasn't there, so Margaret's mother's brother Robert John Lodge⁹ gave her away.¹⁰

The West Australian published the following on 23 September:¹⁰

DoneganHall
Wedding.

THE marriage was solemnised on Tuesday evening, September 15, at St. Mary's Church, Colin-street, West Perth, between Mr. Peter Donegan, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Donegan, of Subiaco, and Miss Margaret Hall, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Aubrey Hall, of Carnarvon. The Rev. F. Stillwell performed the ceremony. The date chosen for the wedding also marked the celebration of the golden wedding of the bride's grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. T.S. Lodge, of Broome-street, Cottesloe.

In the absence of her father the bride was given away by her uncle, Mr. Jack Lodge, and wore a charming trained frock of white lace, cut on gracefully simple lines. Her filmy tulle veil (which had been worn by her mother on her wedding day) was held in place with a halo of silver lame and orange blossom, and she carried a beautiful bouquet of white plum blossom and clematis.

There were three bridesmaids, Misses Patricia and Judith Donegan, and Joan Hall Miss Patricia Donegan wore a graceful cape frock of pale coral pink georgette and carried a posey of pink and mauve flowers. Misses Judith Donegan and Joan Hall wore frocks of mauve georgette relieved with deep violet, and carried posies of violets. Mr. Tom Draper was best man and Messrs. G. McCausland and F. Martin were groomsmen.

After the ceremony a small reception was held at 8 Outram-street, West Perth, the home of Mrs. Ernest Hall, who wore a deep blue

lace frock. Mrs. A. Hall (mother of the bride) chose a frock of navy blue floral georgette and carried a bouquet of crimson sweet peas. Mrs. Ernest Donegan (mother of the bride groom) wore a saxe blue frock with a matching coat of blue velvet. Special guests at the reception were Mr. and Mrs. T. S. Lodge (the grandparents of the bride) whose toasts were honoured with those of the bride and bridegroom. Later in the evening the bride and bridegroom left by motor car for their honeymoon, the bride travelling in a smart ensemble in two shades of blue.

They had one daughter, in 1938.¹¹ Peter died in 1939 in an aviation accident.

She remarried on 2 July 1941¹² to William Murray Wilson¹³

(also in St George's Cathedral¹²), with whom she had two sons.

Lived at 8 Outram Street in West Perth for nine years (including WW2) with Judy.¹⁴ She rented the house from her father's cousin Ernest Hall.

She died on 21 February 2000 in East Fremantle, Western Australia, at the Braemar nursing home, and her ashes were interred in Murray's grave at Karrakatta.

Mother sent me a parcel of [?head Bays] and I wired her for, per Mrs Lammond & I was hoping for news of Gag, but she did not write, so I only know up to when Gag had just gone to the hospital with Mr

Scott.

I shall be glad if there is no [?worry] for a while after I finish here, have now had thirteen weeks continuous shearing [?]. Had two smacks in my left eye from scrub, my [?horses] just about turn off me in the scrub & my horse came down with [?] [?]. It is [?] that [?Carnamagh], [?], [?], in all 15 [?flatinis] are putting up c500 each, trying. [?] [?] opening [?] transport it will be a hard thing for your [?father].

Tomorrow we leave Tokyo my sweet & I must say I'm very glad of it. We're only going as far as Kamaya, right in the south of Japan then the next day will go to Lasag, stopping at Okinawa on the way & then the following day we hope to get to Lahnan. Gosh it will be good to get back there & get some mail darling. That's the big thing about getting away from here oh I do want a letter or two from my wife so badly beloved & in just a few days I'll have some. It's such a good thought.

This trip has been good that it's let us see a bit of Japan & get some idea of how the surrender is going & also get an idea of how the people here [?] it all. This place we've been staying at has been great for getting different ?? from the ?? & then last night we spoke for a long time with a Jap who was very good on his English & we get this idea. All most interesting.

Yesterday I got a few back copies of the "Nippon Times" & I think I'll post them home from Laboun. There's lots of interesting

reading in them & perhaps we can peruse them at leisure together later on. I'd rather post them than carry them as I don't want to have too much to take with me on the trip home.

This afternoon we had quite a good trip to Yokahama it's about fifteen or twenty miles south of Tokyo but really the two cities run into each other. The damage is truly amazing. All the way it's just one great ?? of burnt ?? land one can't say burnt out buildings as there aren't any shells left every thing is flat on the ground, just a litter of rusting iron. Here & there of course there are parts that escaped but they are very few. The outstanding thing I thought was the number of office safes there are just standing in the open. They're all that's left of hundreds of buildings & offices & factories they're rusty & all broken open, but they still stand there as a reminder that once that place was a building. I didn't realise before that a city had so many safes before. The thing is that all of these buildings were just wood & iron. The tale that Tokya would burn well was very true.
